What does the law say?

NZ - Health & Safety at Work (General Risk & Workplace Management) Regulations 2016

Section 14: Duty to prepare, maintain, and implement emergency plan

AU - Work Health and Safety Regulations 2011

Regulation 43: Duty to prepare, maintain, and implement emergency plan

PCBUs must ensure that an emergency plan is **prepared**

- Comprehensive overview of all potential emergencies that could unfold in the workplace and the procedures for each
- Should be tailored to specific locations
- Workers should have the opportunity to add their input
- Should include: evacuation plan, procedures for notifying emergency services, medical treatment procedures, effective emergency communication procedures, training and preparation procedures



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PCBUs must **test and maintain** the emergency plan

- All versions of the emergency plan should be practiced, not just the simple evacuation one
- Movements are timed, improvement actions are noted and followed up on, clear directions are given, and respect is provided to running the drill



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

PCBUs must **implement** the emergency plan

- If a crisis hits and all the previous steps were successfully completed, the emergency plan provides the greatest layer of protection for everyone involved and it's ready to be implemented.

A PCBU who contravenes this regulation commits an offense and is liable on conviction (...)



Emergency Drills: Common Pain Points

-  **Paper or PDFs** -----> **Live Digital Workflows**
Prone to loss, hard to update and collaborate

Centralised view of upcoming drills and drill history
